#### A JUST WORLD FOR ALL

Despite a difficult two years, YMCAs around the world have been rebounding and redoubling their efforts to serve as a platform for young people to take social action on pressing global issues. Thanks to critical support from World Service, YMCAs were better positioned to overcome the economic crises caused by COVID-19 and work towards a bolder vision, prioritizing community wellbeing, a sustainable planet, and a just world for all.

#### 2021 Movement Strengthening and World Service Impact

Movement Strengthening is the intentional multilateral process to strategically advance global social equity by building the capacity of Ys in the US and abroad to serve diverse and changing communities. It is a multi-faceted process, linked to the UN Sustainable Development Goals, that involves mobilizing technical and financial support for greater local impact. In 2021, local US Ys and Y-USA provided financial and technical support valued at \$2.5 million to build the institutional capacity of 57 national YMCA movements abroad and area alliances, engaging multiple US Ys that also benefitted in the process. This report highlights some of the ways that YMCAs around the world are responding to the multiple crises of 2021 in partnership with the U.S. YMCA Movement.

## EQUIPPING YOUNG PEOPLE FOR THE FUTURE OF WORK THROUGH YOUTH-LED SOLUTIONS

Building off the Youth-Led Solutions Summit on Climate Action in October 2020, the World YMCA organized a summit on the Future of Work, aiming to empower young people to identify their unique employment pathway. Over 1,400 youth from over 100 countries participated in the three-day summit. Afterwards, groups of young people applied for funding to implement their ideas and address youth employment and entrepreneurship. Y-USA helped



mobilize over \$200,000 of seed grants and technical support for the solutions. Applications include projects such as designing more equitable internship opportunities for youth, supporting undocumented college students as they pursue careers, increasing access to camp and outdoor leadership employment to young people of color, and making YMCA employment more accessible for young people with disabilities.

## YMCA HOMES FOR MIGRANT YOUTH IMPACT



Founded in 1991, the YMCA Homes for Migrant Youth (or Casas YMCA) provide vital services to unaccompanied migrant youth who are deported from the US to Mexico. To date, the YMCA Homes have served more than 73,000 migrant youth with temporary safe shelter, balanced nutrition, clothing, medical assistance, psychological counseling,

legal aid, life skills, recreational activities, and family reunification services. Of the total migrant youth served, 80 percent are reunited with their family and 20 percent make alternative life plans. YMCAs in the United States have historically supported the YMCA Homes for Migrant Youth. Since August 2021, a cohort of U.S. YMCAs and community partners are re-organizing under the YMCA Border Initiative Coalition to raise support for the YMCA Homes by engaging US communities.

#### YMCA ETHIOPIA STEPS UP DURING CIVIL UNREST

In 2021, Ethiopia found itself engulfed in a deadly internal unrest that placed more than 2 million people at high risk of hunger. While maintaining its focus on its core programs of youth development and promoting healthy living, YMCA Ethiopia mobilized multiple local and international partners (including YMCA World Service) to attend to the emergency needs of the population in the country's Tigray region.

In addition to hosting nearly 2,000 internally displaced persons at its facilities, YMCA Ethiopia delivered supplies of food, clean water, clothing, and medicine to 2,800 individuals made vulnerable due to the civil conflict.

#### UBUNTU: RACIAL HEALING THROUGH CROSS CULTURAL CONVERSATIONS WITH YMCA COLOMBIA

Over five virtual sessions during the months of October and November, the Colombia Coalition of YMCAs hosted a dialogue series to discuss the impact of anti-Black racism in the US and Colombia. With interactive activities and guest speakers from both within and outside the Y, participants explored how racism affects individuals and the YMCA. By the end of the series, attendees left with a deeper understanding of racism's impact



and critical resources to advance anti-racism within their home YMCAs.

### TAKING CLIMATE ACTION THROUGH OVERNIGHT CAMP

With support from YMCA World Service and its partner the Frost Valley YMCA, YMCA Kosovo is building Camp Pjetershan, the first overnight camp in the West Balkans. This project evolved to invest in young people by creating a residential center which can be used by children and young people in Kosovo to develop life skills, promote civic engagement, engage in peacebuilding, and address pressing social issues. While the camp does not officially open until 2022, the YMCA has already been providing a space for young people to take climate action by developing a "Green Area" at camp,

which includes
